Jorge → He

Annetta → She

Edik and Antoaneta → They

Kelly and I → We

The chair → It

Laura and you → You

The apples → They

***When you change a named person or object to a pronoun, the verb form does not change.**

Jorge walks to work. He walks to work.

Eric and Maria do their homework. They do their homework.

Kelly and I are in the classroom. We are in the classroom.
